Wiki WHAT??? - Recording our History

For those with Internet access the Group has created a website that aims to provide a 'living' history of the Group using photos and other associated records from both the archives and as they happen

It is in the early stages of development and uses technology known as a "wiki" (which is Maori for "Quick") and is basically an electronic version of a whiteboard.
